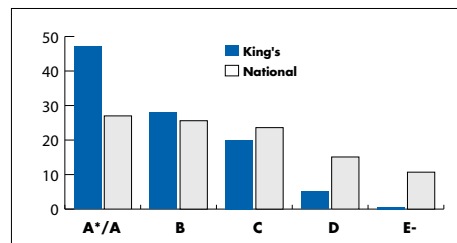


# King's Results

## A LEVEL RESULTS SMASH RECORD

As a group, King's A Level students smashed the school's record as a stunning 47% of all grades were achieved at A\* or A. In all, 121 students received their results with 36 students achieving at least three A\*/As or better. 75% of grades gained at A\*/B level, with the A-C pass rate an impressive 95%.

Chris Fray and Jack Leslie (below) were among the straight A students. Chris gained straight A grades in Classics, History and English Literature and will now study Classical Studies at Manchester and hopes to do for the ancient world what Brian Cox has done for Astrophysics. Jack Leslie gained an A\* in Maths, with A grades in Further Maths, Politics and Economics and hopes to enter the world of politics.

# Infant & Junior success

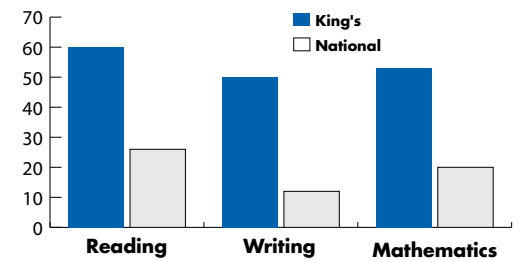
Even the youngest children at King's celebrated stunning results in the summer! There is a statutory requirement that all 3 & 4 year olds, the Early Years Foundation Stage, have 'levels of achievement' monitored and measured on a 9 point scale across some 13 strands. These include personal, social and emotional development, Communication, Language and Literacy, Problem Solving and several other areas. The national expectation is that children will achieve Level 6. All King's children achieved this level - across every single strand – but many King's pupils were achieving the very highest level – a level 9.

The next milestone is Key Stage One, for the Year Two children. Once again the children excelled against national norms (see charts), bucking the trends especially for Writing where the percentage of Level 3's attained was over 4 times the national average. These achievements are all the more astounding when it is remembered that children are not assessed for entry to the Infants.

The final milestone, Key Stage Two, assesses the progress made by the end of the juniors at Year 6 when children are expected to reach Level 4. Once again the results were a triumph. In all areas the junior children performed far beyond national norms; three quarters of the children achieved Level 5 in Reading, in Writing the percentage of Level 5's was over 3 times the national average and in Mathematics it was double the national average.

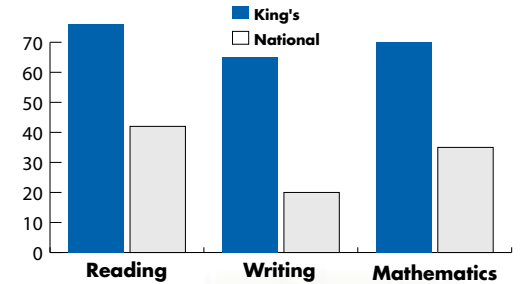
*As an independent school, King's is not tied to the National Curriculum and the curriculum is based upon, but broader than, the statutory requirements. Developments in this area are closely monitored. All of the Year 2 and Year 6 tests were marked and moderated internally.*

*The expected national average for a 7-year-old child is level 2B.*

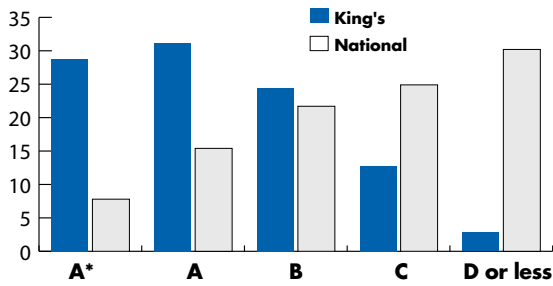
**Percentage Level 5 at Key Stage 2**
